

Objective: Students will discover their unique craft recommendation results and learn about what a career in those crafts entails.

Pework Required (Prepare Phase):

- CareerStarter student accounts are created.
- Student profiles are filled out.

Activity Sequence and Delivery Information: The following activities should be completed in the order in which they appear. They are designed to be flexible for your students and planning needs. The activities can be implemented in a single class period or spread across a week or semester.

Activity & Time	Instructor Delivery Notes
Career Quiz 5–10 minutes	<p>Lesson Implementation Guide:</p> <p>This can be done as homework or an in-class activity.</p> <p>Make sure the students can easily navigate to the Career Quiz link. Tell students the quizzes must be taken individually. This is not a group assignment.</p> <p>What Students Should Do:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Complete their career quizzes on the CareerStarter site. 2. Do not click out of their results page without taking a picture or completing the Career Quiz Worksheet in the next section. <p>Important Note: Students will only be able to see their results on screen at the end of the quiz. Activity & Time	Instructor Delivery Notes
<p>Career Quiz Worksheet</p> <p>30 minutes</p>	<p>Lesson Implementation Guide:</p> <p>This can be done as homework or an in-class activity.</p> <p>Each student should complete the Career Quiz Worksheet for their individual results on the Career Quiz. This document is the basis for the rest of the CareerStarter activities, so students should have it with them anytime they are working in CareerStarter.</p> <p>The Career Quiz Exit Ticket will help you know each student's results. They can help you plan future lessons centered around their career path.</p> <p>This activity would work well as a Think, Pair, Share or Jigsaw Discussion opportunity after students document their Career Quiz results.</p> <p>What Students Should Do:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Using the results from the Career Quiz, complete the Career Quiz Worksheet. 2. Complete the Career Quiz Exit Ticket and turn it in to the instructor. <p>Resources Needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Laptop/Phone • Career Quiz Results • Career Quiz Worksheet • Career Quiz Exit Ticket <p>Graded Point Value Suggestion: 20–25 points</p>
<p>Craft Exploration Worksheet</p> <p>15–30 minutes</p>	<p>Lesson Implementation Guide:</p> <p>This can be done as homework or an in-class activity.</p> <p>Each student should complete the Craft Exploration Worksheet. This activity helps the student dive deep into the details of what it means to be a professional in that craft.</p> <p>If the student is completing the worksheet for the first time, we suggest they focus on the #1 craft on their Career Quiz results.</p> <p>This worksheet can be reused at any point in the semester to have your students continue their research into different crafts connected to your lesson content. This would also work well as a Think, Pair, Share or Jigsaw Discussion activity.</p> <p>What Students Should Do:</p> <p>Using their results and reflections from the Career Quiz Worksheet, complete the Craft Exploration Worksheet on either their top craft or a craft of their choice.</p> <p>Resources Needed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Laptop/Phone • Career Quiz Worksheet • Craft Exploration Worksheet <p>Graded Point Value Suggestion: 10 points</p>
